Re: Conversion of Canadian Westinghouse  
Type "CDE" watt-hour meter to type "CS"  
Mounting.


Dear Sirs:

This is to advise you that the National Research Council has approved of the conversion of type "CDE" watt-hour meters, manufactured by the Canadian Westinghouse Company, Hamilton, Ontario, to the type "CS" mounting.

In order that we may have some indication on our records that a type "CDE" meter has been converted to a type "CS" mounting, the type designation should be "CDE-S". The letter "S" will indicate that the conversion has been made.

In this connection, I would refer you to Section 2 of Article IV of the "Departmental Instructions to Inspectors regarding the Inspection of Electricity Meters", and it will be necessary for the inspector to satisfy himself that anyone contemplating this conversion is capable of doing it. I think in this particular case it will not be necessary to place a distinguishing mark such as "X" after the serial number. The change in the type designation will be all that is necessary.
