The weighing of commodities in trade.

DESCRIPTION:

These devices are Electronic Check Stand
Scales and are an integral part of and
interfaced to an approved type Electronic
Cash Register Point-of-Sale Terminal.

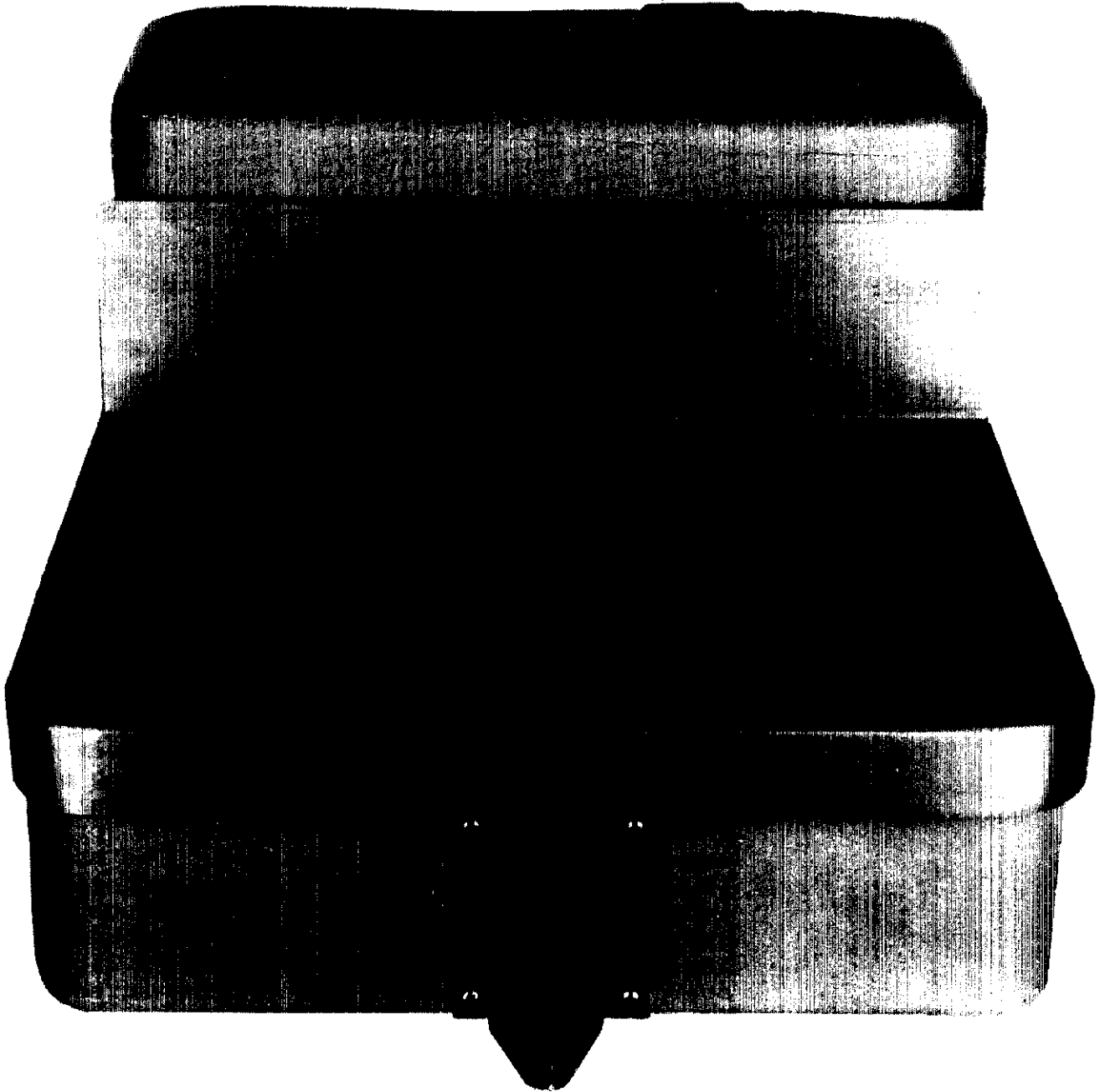
The lever system consists of a main lever
and a secondary lever, both levers being of
V shape and cast construction. Load resist-
ance is by means of a pair of tension spring
assemblies connected in parallel. The model
1500V is equipped with an optical projection
indication system, utilizing a translucent
chart attached to the main lever in conjunct-
ion with the customary arrangement of light
source, lenses, mirrors and viewing screen.

The scale base is of cast aluminum. Housings
are of sheet metal with enamel finish. The
load platter is of stainless steel.

Both of these models are equipped with
platter lockout and motion detection.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS
OPERATION PROCEDURE:

When the items to be weighed are placed on the scale platter, the operator presses the cash register's "Scale" key that activates the release of the scale's platter lockout and the weight data is transmitted to the computer and the display. The operator then enters on the cash register the price per pound or product code number. The cash register system then displays the computed value and prints the register tape.

TESTING:

The standard tests for a retail counter scale shall apply.
