Rating of Apparatus: Maximum capacity 13 gpm.

Application: Retail gasoline trade.


Description: These dispensers are the same in internal component arrangement and external appearance as the corresponding models on S.WA-554, S.WA-555 and S.WA-584, except that the upper doors on the cabinet are made deeper to accommodate the built-in lighting assembly.


On the models designated by the prefix "R", the major working components are taken from older approved dispensers as indicated above, and are thoroughly overhauled to perform substantially as well as new ones before being installed in the new cabinets. New current production components are installed in place of original components beyond repair. Normally, the only new components added will be a separate switch ("Cam-Ac" mechanism) and see-gauge.

Testing: The standard tests for a gasoline dispenser shall apply.
