DEVICE APPROVED: Gilbarco Transac 12 electronic cashier's console and accessories for use in self-serve gasoline dispenser operations in conjunction with Gilbarco Highline 111B dispensers.

APPLICATION: For use in self-serve gasoline dispensing systems.

DESCRIPTION: The Transac 12 is the same as Transac 11 (S.WA-1080) except that the former has several additional features including a dual memory feature and dual level unit price setting.

By means of the dual memory feature the sale data for two consecutive deliveries from a dispenser may be retained in memory, thus expediting operations by enabling a second customer to begin taking delivery before the previous customer has made payment.

The dual level pricing feature permits the setting of two prices for each product for day/night sales, cash/credit sales, etc. Provision is made for presetting both prices so that the desired price level may be selected by a key-operated selector switch.

Aside from the above, the Transac 12 requires the same operating procedures on the part of the station cashier as those applying to the Transac 11, and which are detailed on Notice of Approval No. S.WA-1080.

MARKING: On self-serve dispensers there shall be installed, on each dial face, a permanent legend in letters at least 3/16" high and reading as follows:

"In case of disagreement between this register and the cashier's register, this register shall be taken as correct." or "Charges must agree with this register."

TESTING: The standard tests for self-serve gasoline dispensers shall apply.
